

The Concord Movie Lives On

Last year, actor and stuntman Jeff Mosley tried to work some magic for the ailing Mt Diablo School District by preselling DVDs for a movie he was making, to be shot in Concord using Concord talent.

“Last year we gave the \$4,080 dollars raised to MDUSD,” Mosley said. “This is not a school fundraiser anymore, just to be clear. I have worked in the movie industry for 20 years as a Screen Actors Guild stuntman and actor.”

Mosley takes this project seriously. The working title of this feature length (90 min) film is “Chasing Rodriguez”; the story of 4 young teenagers who enter a 24 hour film contest to win a cash prize. While making their film they inadvertently capture a robbery on film. The film will be based and filmed in Concord and the immediate surrounding areas of Clayton, Pleasant Hill and Martinez

What is different about this film is that it uses “crowdfunding” as a funding source.

“This gives us a much better chance of making money to produce the next film,” Mosley explains. “We plan on forging joint venture relations with local business who are willing to donate a product or service to help us fund the movie. The business gets the publicity, we get the funding and the customer/client/viewer/fan gets something at a discount through an eBay auction or a buy it now sale.”

Mosley is hopeful that there will be a strong resonance within the local community. “If we raise enough money we will start filming the second week of August 2011. Actors and “real people” will have the opportunity to be in the movie 3 ways: 1. The traditional way of auditioning, 2. Bid for a role or 3.
